If credit is extended, the Hirer acknowledges that Globe Power USA requires payment within 30 days from receipt of invoice. In the event of failure to timely pay any invoice, Applicant agrees to pay a service charge to Globe Power USA on such delinquent invoice(s) until fully paid, at the maximum rate allowed by the laws and jurisdiction of the originating location stated on the invoice, and all reasonable collection costs, including but not limited to attorney's fees.

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Notice: Any signature (including any electronic symbol or process attached to, or associated with, a contract or other record and adopted by a Person with the intent to sign, authenticate or accept such contract or record) hereto or to any other certificate, agreement or document related to this transaction, and any contract formation or records-keeping through electronic means shall have the same legal validity and enforceability as a manually executed signature or use of a paper-based record keeping system to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, including the Federal Electronic Signatures in Global and National Commerce Act or any similar state law based on the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act and the parties hereby waive any objection to the contrary.

Under the law, persons selling or leasing construction equipment may not accept resale or exemption certificates from contractors claiming tax exemptions on construction equipment. The sales tax law requires contractors to pay tax on their equipment regardless of whether it is purchased or rented.

A contractor is the consumer of all equipment used in performing contracts to improve real property. Even a contractor performing the taxable service of repairing, restoring, or remodeling non-residential real property is required to pay tax when purchasing or renting any equipment used to perform the service. A contractor may not claim a resale exemption on this equipment.

Additionally, there is no exemption in the sales tax law for equipment used by a contractor who is performing contracts to improve real property for exempt entities. This is true regardless of the type of exempt entity (e.g., federal government, state or local government, school districts, charitable hospital, or church.) A contractor performing a contract for a direct payment permit holder may not claim an exemption for equipment used in performing the contract. The contractor should pay tax on the purchase or rental of the equipment and not give the equipment company an exemption certificate, unless the contractor has a Texas direct payment permit.
